History of Morse Code in Humboldt

The creation of the Dominion Telegraph line led to the establishment of the Humboldt Telegraph Station at the Original Humboldt Site.

Catherine Weldon lived at Original Humboldt site and became the first female telegraph operator in the west.

The Dominion Telegraph line sent messages using a combination of dots and dashes. Catherine would then decode these dots and dashes into words.
